Early Intervention for Young Drug Users

What FreD can achieve

The intervention supports young persons in developing a critical attitude to their alcohol and drug use. Around 80% of participants consume less after completing the course or stop taking illegal drugs altogether.

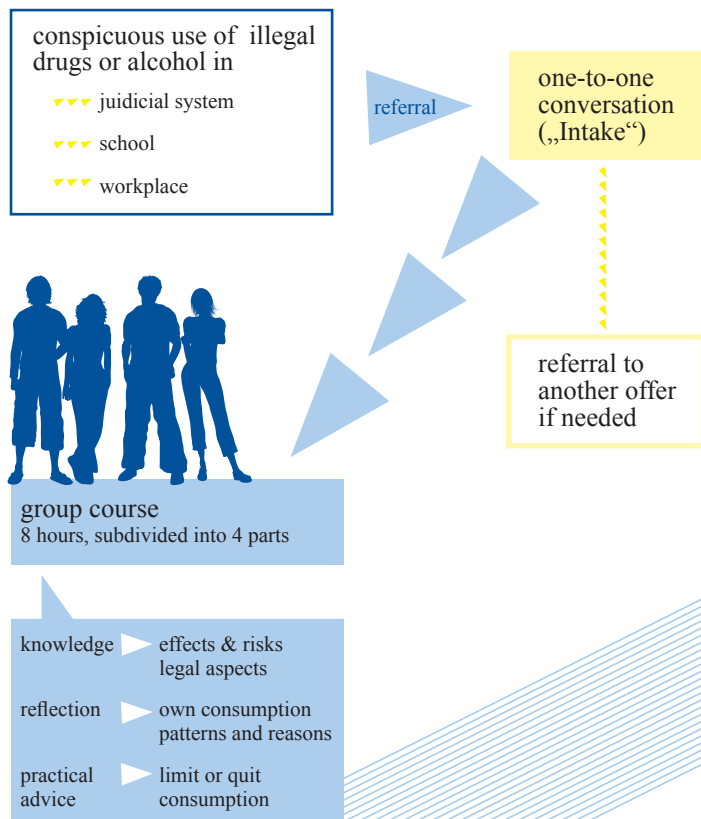
An evaluation study has confirmed these positive results of the German model project FreD at a European level (facts of the interim report).

Training of technical competences

The training course will teach you:

- ▶▶▶ how to motivate young persons to re-think their drug use and initiate changes in their behaviour,
- ▶▶▶ how to structure eight hours of group work and how to use interactive methods in such a way that more than 80% of participants are (very) satisfied with the course,
- ▶▶▶ how to build sustainable structures of cooperation and networks in your town/region,
- ▶▶▶ how to take into account the respective legal context,
- ▶▶▶ how to do the accompanying course evaluation.

Structure of Intervention



Participants

- experts in addiction prevention and youth welfare,
- related professional groups working with young persons.

Previous experience in working with young persons and/or addiction prevention and care is helpful. Training two experts per country is an advantage in implementing this approach.

Workshop language

The workshop language will be English.
