Your letter of March 18th in which you make an enquiry for your husband Sergeant H.A.J. Gage, No.1587070, Royal Air Force has been passed to us from our Headquarters Branch which accounts for the delay. <sup>in our reply</sup> Thank you for sending us the names of your husband's companions.

We are so sorry to tell you that so far no information has been received about him or any of the members of the crew, but all possible enquiries are being made. Any news coming from the International Red Cross Committee at Geneva or from any other source concerning your husband or his companions will be passed to you immediately.
